## **SECTION 1: VEGETABLES AND FRUITS** – *open to all ages*

### **Sponsored by Dursley Pet Shop**

- 102 3 Round beetroot

## **SECTION 6: CRAFTS – open to all ages**

# *Show Rules*

1. The Cam and Dursley Flower and Produce Show is open to everyone. There are no restrictions.
2. The entry fee is 20p per exhibit for adults (17 and over) and 10p per exhibit for children.
3. No exhibitor can show more than one entry in each class.
4. Children's ages on the day of the show must be stated on their entry forms and all exhibitor's cards.
5. Entry forms are to be posted or delivered by hand to the Chantry Centre.
6. Entry fees should be paid on the day of the show when exhibits are delivered to the Chantry Centre.
7. All exhibits must be the result of unaided work by the exhibitor.
8. All exhibits to be displayed at the Chantry Centre, Long Street, Dursley by 9.00am on the day of the Show.
9. Exhibitors must provide their own vases for display of exhibits.
10. Root vegetable tops must have foliage trimmed back to approx. 8cm. Onions must have roots trimmed, tops tied down and loose skin removed. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces. Peas, beans and fruit must be displayed with some stalk attached. Leeks should have their roots and leaves trimmed so that they are a max 35cm.
11. Points will be awarded in all classes. 3 for first, 2 for second, 1 for third.
12. The judge's decision will be final.
13. Exhibits should have a title where possible, for the interest of visitors, but have no identifying marks, writing or labels.
14. Cam and Dursley Flower and Produce Show and the Chantry Centre cannot be held responsible for any show exhibit that is lost, stolen or damaged.
